

#### Report on" No suicide among teenagers"

Report: Teenage suicide is a critical issue worldwide, yet certain demographic groups, notably degree-seeking young women, display lower rates of suicide compared to other populations. This Guest lecture aims to explore the factors that contribute to this phenomenon and to provide insights into potential preventive strategies.

Synopsis of the Guest Lecture:

Factors Contributing to Low Suicide Rates:

Education and Social Support: The pursuit of higher education often provides a sense of purpose and social integration, which can buffer against suicidal thoughts. Degree-seeking students are engaged in academic and social activities that offer a supportive network.

Access to Resources: Adolescents enrolled in degree programs usually have access to counseling services, mental health resources, and supportive environments within educational institutions. These resources can facilitate early intervention and support for mental health issues.

Resilience and Coping Skills: Higher education can foster resilience and improve coping mechanisms. Students are often equipped with problem-solving skills, stress management techniques, and emotional regulation strategies.

Positive Peer Influence: Degree programs offer opportunities for positive peer interactions and friendships, which can enhance emotional well-being and reduce feelings of isolation or hopelessness.

Parental and Family Support: Teenagers pursuing degrees often benefit from supportive family environments that prioritize education and emotional well-being.

Preventive Strategies and Recommendations:

Despite the lower incidence of suicide among degree-seeking teenage girls, preventive strategies remain crucial. Here are recommendations:

Mental Health Awareness Programs: Educational institutions should prioritize mental health awareness and provide comprehensive counseling services to students. Strengthening Support Networks: Enhance peer support programs and create avenues for open discussions on mental health issues.

Parental Involvement: Encourage parental involvement in students' educational journeys and emphasize the importance of emotional support.

Early Intervention: Implement early detection and intervention programs to identify at-risk individuals and provide timely support.

#### Resolutions Proposed:

Enhanced Mental Health Education: Implement comprehensive mental health education programs in schools to raise awareness, reduce stigma, and promote early intervention.

Accessible Support Services: Ensure accessible and confidential mental health support services within educational institutions and communities to facilitate timely intervention.

Youth Engagement Programs: Develop youth engagement programs that promote positive coping skills, resilience, and peer support.

Parental Education and Involvement: Provide resources and workshops for parents to recognize signs of distress in their children and foster open communication about mental health.




