It is the largest Youth Wing in India. With a current strength of 200 dedicated volunteers, the NSS actively engages in various socio-welfare activities in and around the Visakhapatnam region, aiming for the student's personality development through community service.

Aim: 'Personality development through community service'

Objectives: To

- 6. Facilitate participation in National Youth Festivals to inherit cultural heritage and communal harmony.
- 7. Fecilitate student participation in National Integration Camps annually across different states, promoting talent exhibition and integrated personality growth.
- 8. Conduct annual special camps involving all volunteers to foster teamwork, interaction with society, and dedicated service.

Community service rendered by the college level students are:

- Adult education programs for the weaker sections of the community
- Voluntary blood donation
- Helping patients in hospitals
- Helping inmates of orphanages, old age homes the physically handicapped etc.
- Involve in relief work during natural calamities/emergencies such as cyclones, floods, famine, earthquakes, tsunamis, etc., from time to time all over the country.
